SPEAKER HIGHLIGHTS

Welcome Addresses:

Dr. A. Richard Bonanno

Dr. A. Richard Bonanno is Vice Provost for Outreach and Engagement, Associate Dean for the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, and Director of the NC Cooperative Extension Service, known as NC State Extension. Through faculty and agents in all 100 counties, Extension connects research-based information to farmers, youth, and the public.

Dr. Bonanno started his career at NC State in the 1980's as a faculty member in the Department of Horticultural Science. He left State in 1989 to return to Massachusetts, where he managed the family vegetable and flower farm, worked parttime in Extension for the University of Massachusetts, and was president of the Massachusetts Farm Bureau Federation. Rich is glad to have the opportunity to be back in NC and rejoined NC State on February 1, 2016.



Dr. Ivory W. Lyles

As Vice Provost for Extension and Engagement and director of the OSU Extension Service, Dr. Ivory W. Lyles provides leadership and oversight of Oregon State University's nationally regarded extension and engagement programs, including faculty, staff, and offices in every county in the state. Lyles works to create opportunities for extension experts to engage with business people, growers, foresters, youth, and community leaders across Oregon, and to focus inquiry and teaching on issues important to Oregon communities. He has served as director of University of Nevada Cooperative Extension and associate dean for engagement in the College of Agriculture, Biotechnology and Natural Resources at UNR; dean and director of Land Grant Programs at Alcorn State University; and director of the Cooperative Extension Service and associate vice president of agriculture at the University of Arkansas - Little Rock. He holds a doctorate in agricultural education, community, and rural development from The Ohio State University.



Keynote Address:

Dr. Dominic J. Ledesma

Dr. Dominic J. Ledesma (he, his, él) is the Chief Diversity Officer for the University of Wisconsin-Madison's Division of Extension. He served as the founder and interim director of Extension's Office of Access, Inclusion, and Compliance (OAIC) for two years. In November of 2021, he was hired as Extension's inaugural Chief Diversity Officer. His role and unit focus on leading and guiding institutional efforts that promote IDEA Innovation (Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, Access) in Extension activities statewide. Dr. Ledesma holds a PhD from UW-Madison's Department of Educational Leadership & Policy Analysis (School of Education) and is a recipient of the Michael W. Apple Fellowship. His professional identity as a scholaradministrator is grounded in Critical Race Theory (CRT) and its connections to organizational behaviors of Predominantly White Institutions (PWIs). Ledesma's research interests include language access policies and practices of public-serving institutions, language rights, applied civil rights law, English language ideologies, and the linguistic and cultural diversity that exists within the upper midwestern region of the United States. His dissertation examined the strategic and systemic management of multilingual communication and the sociocultural factors that contribute to language-based forms of institutional power and privilege. Ledesma holds a B.A. from UW-Madison and a master's in translation and interpretation from the Universidad Autónoma de Guadalajara (Mexico). He was born and raised in St. Paul, Minnesota.

Scott Vignos

Scott Vignos, J.D., joined Oregon State University in October 2015, serving as Vice President and Chief Diversity Officer since November 2022. In this role, Scott collaborates with partners across the university to design and lead the Office of Institutional Diversity's portfolio of diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives. Scott is responsible for guiding implementation of the university's diversity strategic plan – Innovate & Integrate: Plan for Inclusive Excellence – and consulting with university leaders to create a more just and equitable Oregon State.

Scott has an enduring passion for pursuing justice through action. He practiced law in San Francisco at an international law firm and maintained a pro bono practice with the Lawyers Committee for Civil Rights of the San Francisco Bay Area representing clients seeking asylum in the United States. He has worked at the UC Davis School of Law, designing and leading programs to diversify the legal profession, at the East Bay Community Law Center, advocating for low-income and formerly-incarcerated residents of Oakland and Alameda County, and at the UC Davis Immigration Law Clinic, representing non-citizen clients in all phases of removal and asylum proceedings.

Holly Nelson started her career at Chemeketa Community College over 23 years ago. She currently serves as the Executive Dean over Regional Education and Academic Development. Her division includes a wide range of departments, including 3 outreach campuses and centers in Woodburn, Dallas, and McMinnville, Corrections Education, Academic Development or pre-college programming, High School Partnerships, Agricultural Sciences and Technology, and Wine Studies. She started her career teaching Health and Human Performance courses both at Chemeketa and Western Oregon University, later transitioning to administrative roles.

ENLACE Cross-Cultural Community Development Project:

ENLACE is a business development project that implements cross-cultural strategies to implement and promote equal development in communities through education, art, culture, technology, community engagement, and civic education, and by working through a Latino collaborative program called "Guelaguetza Intercultural" (nonprofit project) with individuals, businesses, community organizations, churches, schools, cities, programs, and leaders.


